MAKE CERTAIN PANDEMIC FLEXIBILITIES PERMANENT

- Payment parity for telehealth in Medicaid and commercial insurance
- Healthcare professions changes to increase capacity and access to care, including vaccines



EXPAND HEALTHCARE WORKFORCE BY 20%

- \$10B multiyear investment
- Increased funding for DANY/Creation of NANY
- Expand Diversity in Medicine Program and recruitment
- Develop apprenticeship and job training programs
- Establish interstate licensure compact
- Free tuition, childcare, and transportation for students entering in healthcare professions
- Increased training capacity of medical institutions



EXPAND INSURANCE ACCESS

- Expand income eligibility for Essential Plan
- Align Child Health Plus benefits with Medicaid benefits
- Eliminate the resource eligibility test and raise the income level to 138% FPL for New Yorkers 65 and up and those with disabilities



EXPAND BH AND SUD TREATMENT ACCESS

- Create a MAT program for uninsured individuals
- Expand naloxone and buprenorphine access
- Expand mobile treatment services for opioid addiction
- Enhance suicide prevention
- Provide individuals with supportive recovery housing



PROTECT REPRODUCTIVE ACCESS FOR ALL

• Expand the family planning grant program



SUPPORT LGBTQIA+ HEALTH SERVICES

 Provide support for direct health services, cultural competency education and training, and organizational capacity building



ENHANCE BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE

- \$1B ConnectAll Initiative in urban and rural communities across the state
- Provide grant opportunities to entities to construct open and accessible broadband infrastructure
- Make connections in rural communities
- Expand \$30 per month broadband subsidies for low-income households
- Create statewide digital equity plan.



END HOMELESSNESS

- Create Safe Options Support (SOS) Teams to transition individuals who are street homeless to stable housing in New York City
- SOS Teams will also connect individuals to behavioral health and substance use disorder care as needed
