

FISCAL YEAR 2023 NYS EXECUTIVE BUDGET CHC HIGHLIGHTS

MCVR

FQHCs will continue to receive the 2019 wrap rates for the 2020 rate year



Medicaid and Commercial reimbursement parity for telehealth, including audio-only, when the CHC is the originating or distant site



NANY: Establishes Nurses Across New York Loan Repayment
\$10B Workforce Investments: Includes \$3000 bonuses for providers making less than \$100K at Article 28s
Scope of Practice: Makes NPMA permanent, allows pharmacists to order certain tests, allows physicians & NPs to issue standing orders



Level Funding: PCMH (\$220M), Health Homes (\$524M), Safety Net Pool (\$54.4M), DANY (\$9M), SBHCs (\$8.3M), Rural Health (\$9.4M), Migrant and Seasonal Farm Workers (\$406K)



CAPITAL

\$1.6 billion **Statewide Health Care Facility Transformation Program IV** includes \$25M for capital investments for community providers; \$150M for telehealth infrastructure



Interstate Medical Licensure Compact: Participation will allow health care professionals licensed out of state to practice in New York



Maternal Health: Expands prenatal/postpartum care, extends Medicaid coverage to 1 year postpartum
Managed Care: Directs DOH to procure MCOs & award 2-5/region
Essential Plan: Expands eligibility - but not for undocumented immigrants
Medicaid: Eliminates resource test for older adults and people w/disabilities
