

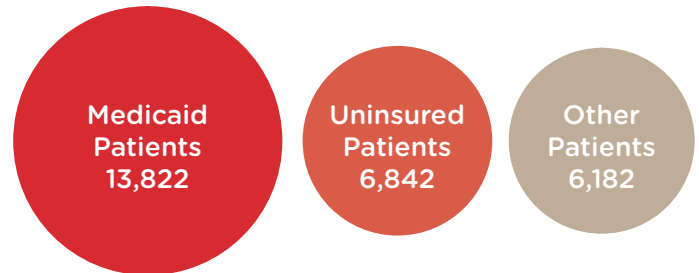


Medicaid, CHCs, and NYS Congressional **District 1** Representative LaLota

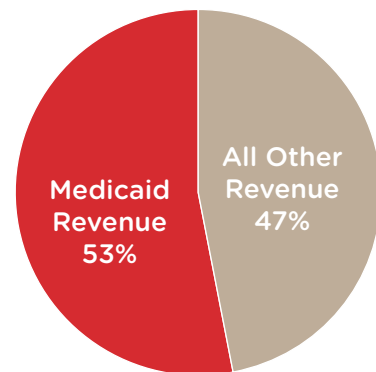
Community Health Centers — CHCs — are independent and patient-governed local non-profits that provide high-quality, comprehensive primary, dental, vision, and behavioral health care to anyone who walks in the door.

In 2023, New York State's CHCs cared for 2.4 million patients, 1 in 8 New Yorkers, of whom 29% were children and 12% were seniors. Nearly 1.5 million, 62%, were Medicaid patients. Medicaid reimbursement is essential for CHCs to sustain comprehensive primary and preventive care in the communities they serve.

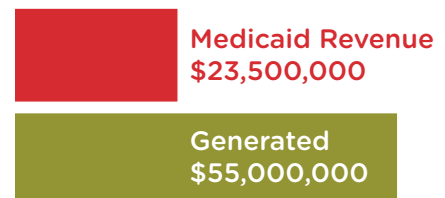
District 1
is home to **11 CHC sites**
26,846 CHC patients
51% of them were covered
by Medicaid.
Another 25% were uninsured.
Cuts to Medicaid will increase
this number.

CHCs get **\$23,500,000 in revenues**
from Medicaid
Medicaid provides the single largest
source of funds for District 1 CHCs.

from **332 CHC-supported jobs**
\$55,000,000 generated by
CHCs for the **economy**
District 1 CHCs generate more than
double as much money for the local
economy as they receive in Medicaid.
