




# Medicaid, CHCs, and NYS Congressional **District 9** Representative Clarke


Community Health Centers — CHCs — are independent and patient-governed local non-profits that provide high-quality, comprehensive primary, dental, vision, and behavioral health care to anyone who walks in the door.

In 2023, New York State's CHCs cared for 2.4 million patients, 1 in 8 New Yorkers, of whom 29% were children and 12% were seniors. Nearly 1.5 million, 62%, were Medicaid patients. Medicaid reimbursement is essential for CHCs to sustain comprehensive primary and preventive care in the communities they serve.

**District 9** is home to **34 CHC sites** and **124,229 CHC patients**. 61% of them were covered by Medicaid. Another 10% were uninsured. Cuts to Medicaid will increase this number.



**District 9** CHCs get **\$112,500,000 in revenues** from Medicaid. Medicaid provides the single largest source of funds for District 9 CHCs.



**District 9** benefits from **1,848 CHC-supported jobs** and **\$328,000,000 generated by CHCs for the economy**. District 9 CHCs generate nearly three times as much money for the local economy as they receive in Medicaid.



**Cuts to Medicaid will cause irreparable damage to CHCs, their patients, their employees, and the local economy in **District 9**.**
