

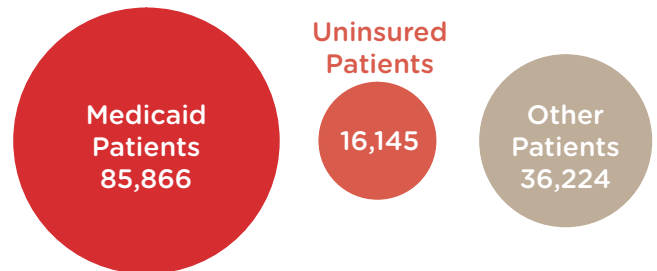


# Medicaid, CHCs, and NYS Congressional **District 10** Representative Goldman

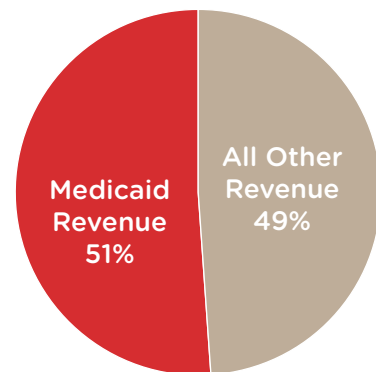
Community Health Centers — CHCs — are independent and patient-governed local non-profits that provide high-quality, comprehensive primary, dental, vision, and behavioral health care to anyone who walks in the door.

In 2023, New York State's CHCs cared for 2.4 million patients, 1 in 8 New Yorkers, of whom 29% were children and 12% were seniors. Nearly 1.5 million, 62%, were Medicaid patients. Medicaid reimbursement is essential for CHCs to sustain comprehensive primary and preventive care in the communities they serve.

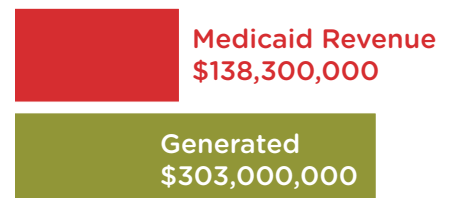
**District 10** is home to **64 CHC sites**  
**138,235 CHC patients**  
62% of them were covered by Medicaid.  
Another 12% were uninsured.  
Cuts to Medicaid will increase this number.



**District 10** CHCs get **\$138,300,000 in revenues** from Medicaid  
Medicaid provides the single largest source of funds for District 10 CHCs.



**District 10** benefits from **1,746 CHC-supported jobs**  
**\$303,000,000 generated by** CHCs for the **economy**  
District 10 CHCs generate more than double as much money for the local economy as they receive in Medicaid.



**Cuts to Medicaid will cause irreparable damage to CHCs, their patients, their employees, and the local economy in **District 10**.**
