Community Health Centers — CHCs — are independent and patient-governed local non-profits that provide high-quality, comprehensive primary, dental, vision, and behavioral health care to anyone who walks in the door.


In 2023, New York State's CHCs cared for 2.4 million patients, 1 in 8 New Yorkers, of whom 29% were children and 12% were seniors. Nearly 1.5 million, 62%, were Medicaid patients. Medicaid reimbursement is essential for CHCs to sustain comprehensive primary and preventive care in the communities they serve.

District 12 32 CHC sites 47,926 CHC patients

52% of them were covered by Medicaid.


Another 14% were uninsured. Cuts to Medicaid will increase this number.



District 12 CHCs get

\$32,200,000 in **revenues** from Medicaid

Medicaid provides the single largest source of funds for District 12 CHCs.



District 12 benefits from

624 CHC-supported jobs \$112,000,000 generated by CHCs for the economy

District 12 CHCs generate more than three times as much money for the local economy as they receive in Medicaid.
