Community Health Centers — CHCs — are independent and patient-governed local non-profits that provide high-quality, comprehensive primary, dental, vision, and behavioral health care to anyone who walks in the door.


In 2023, New York State's CHCs cared for 2.4 million patients, 1 in 8 New Yorkers, of whom 29% were children and 12% were seniors. Nearly 1.5 million, 62%, were Medicaid patients. Medicaid reimbursement is essential for CHCs to sustain comprehensive primary and preventive care in the communities they serve.

District 21 is home to

37 CHC sites 118,732 CHC patients

31% of them were covered by Medicaid.


Another 5% were uninsured. Cuts to Medicaid will increase this number.



District 21 CHCs get

\$27,000,000 in **revenues** from Medicaid

Medicaid plays a key role in funding District 21 CHCs.



District 21 benefits from

1,516 CHC-supported **jobs** \$245,000,000 generated by CHCs for the **economy**

District 21 CHCs generate more than nine times as much money for the local economy as they receive in Medicaid.
