




# Medicaid, CHCs, and NYS Congressional **District 23** Representative Langworthy


Community Health Centers — CHCs — are independent and patient-governed local non-profits that provide high-quality, comprehensive primary, dental, vision, and behavioral health care to anyone who walks in the door.

In 2023, New York State's CHCs cared for 2.4 million patients, 1 in 8 New Yorkers, of whom 29% were children and 12% were seniors. Nearly 1.5 million, 62%, were Medicaid patients. Medicaid reimbursement is essential for CHCs to sustain comprehensive primary and preventive care in the communities they serve.


**District 23** is home to 21 CHC **sites**  
54,076 CHC **patients**  
41% of them were covered by Medicaid.  
Another 7% were uninsured.  
Cuts to Medicaid will increase this number.



**District 23** CHCs get \$22,200,000 in **revenues** from Medicaid  
Medicaid provides the single largest source of funds for District 23 CHCs.



**District 23** benefits from 632 CHC-supported **jobs**  
\$83,000,000 generated by CHCs for the **economy**  
District 23 CHCs generate nearly four times as much money for the local economy as they receive in Medicaid.



**Cuts to Medicaid will cause irreparable damage to CHCs, their patients, their employees, and the local economy in **District 23**.**
