




Medicaid, CHCs, and NYS Congressional **District 25** Representative Morelle


Community Health Centers — CHCs — are independent and patient-governed local non-profits that provide high-quality, comprehensive primary, dental, vision, and behavioral health care to anyone who walks in the door.

In 2023, New York State's CHCs cared for 2.4 million patients, 1 in 8 New Yorkers, of whom 29% were children and 12% were seniors. Nearly 1.5 million, 62%, were Medicaid patients. Medicaid reimbursement is essential for CHCs to sustain comprehensive primary and preventive care in the communities they serve.


District 25 is home to 41 CHC **sites**
115,002 CHC **patients**
56% of them were covered by Medicaid.
Another 4% were uninsured.
Cuts to Medicaid will increase this number.



District 25 CHCs get \$59,300,000 in **revenues** from Medicaid
Medicaid provides the single largest source of funds for District 25 CHCs.



District 25 benefits from 1,705 CHC-supported **jobs**
\$278,000,000 generated by CHCs for the **economy**
District 25 CHCs generate nearly five times as much money for the local economy as they receive in Medicaid.



Cuts to Medicaid will cause irreparable damage to CHCs, their patients, their employees, and the local economy in **District 25.**
