




PrEP use is not commensurate with need.

Key tasks in PrEP care


- Outreach and linkage to care
- Insurance and benefits navigation and re-navigating
- Baseline assessment and prescribing
- Clinical monitoring
- Adherence support
- Re-engagement in PrEP, as needed

Persons Residing in NYS† at End of 2020





*Any VL, CD4, or nucleotide sequence test during the year




